- 1989 Adam was approved to join the Shanghai Artists Association and become the youngest member in its history
- 1987 Adam co-founded the first Shanghai Painting Fair, Shanghai 459 Painting Fair, with young and middle-aged painters in Shanghai
- 1985 Adam held his first solo exhibition in China and became one of the earliest artists to hold solo exhibitions after China's reform and opening up
- 1978 The Department of Dance and Beauty of Shanghai Opera Academy failed Adam in the examination and he refused to apply to other art colleges outside Shanghai
- 1970 At 10 years old, Chang knew he wanted to be a painter and began to receive basic training in Chinese calligraphy and traditional painting.
